The Dirleton Village Association (DVA)

The DVA is a registered charity which represents the hub of the community on matters such as planning and conservation and facilitates all community matters and wishes for the future of the village. Every year we strive to do our best for the community.

The DVA committee currently comprises eight village residents who were elected at the November AGM. Anyone is eligible to stand and indeed this is encouraged.

The DVA membership year runs from 1 September to 31 August and costs between £2-5 depending on single/family membership. Donations are also welcome. Joining up is easy, just email: dva@dirletonvillage.org

Meetings are usually held in the Kirk Hall at 7.00 pm and the agenda and minutes are circulated by email and posted on the website www.dirletonvillage.org

Over the last 5 years the DVA has been responsible for many projects to enhance the village and surrounding areas including: public toilet improvements; quality benches; new noticeboards; alleviation of flooding on church green; additional parking on church green; repairs to the war memorial; 20 mph signs; heritage lighting; wildflower and hedge planting; and the planting of 70 trees as part of the late Queen's Green Canopy project, one for each year of her reign. The last two projects involved many of the pupils from the Primary school.

The DVA actively encourages all types of community activity and acts as the main discussion forum for environmental and conservation issues affecting Dirleton and surrounding areas. Its structure is democratic and open, and anyone may raise issues for discussion at its meetings.

The Community Council and North Berwick Coastal Area Partnership

The Community Council, comprising up to 13 elected councillors, two of them nominated by the DVA, covers Gullane, Aberlady, Dirleton, Drem and the surrounding rural areas. It meets monthly by rotation in Gullane, Aberlady and Dirleton and its role is to find out and represent local community views and wishes to East Lothian Council and other public bodies, such as Police Scotland and the NHS. Community Council – GADDabout

The North Berwick Coastal Area Partnership has a similar remit but covering the whole of the North Berwick Coastal Area ward. It includes representatives of the DVA and of other village organisations.



Dirleton

Dirleton is a historic village centred around the ancient castle and the surrounding area has a multitude of enjoyable walks and activities. The parish boundary incorporates Archerfield Village to the north, Ferrygate Cottages to the east, Queenstonbank Cottages to the west and Fenton Barns to the south. The village and the immediate surrounding area are designated as a Conservation Area, giving them special conservation status. Access to Dirleton Castle and Gardens

Historic Environment Scotland (HES) run Dirleton Castle and Gardens. At present the castle is closed for safety survey assessments, but the Gardens are open and free for members of the DVA on presentation of a valid membership card.

Community activities and events in Dirleton

Dirleton Good Neighbours (DGN)

DGN are a Constituted Community Group launched at the beginning of September 2017, within the remit to promote social activities in Dirleton within the aims of being healthy, active and connected.

<u>Dirleton Lunch Hub - In January 2022</u> our monthly Lunch Hub restarted on the 1 Wednesday of the month from 12-2pm. The venue is the Kirk Hall and thanks to our volunteers we offer delicious homemade soup, bread and cakes. With a cost of £5.00. This is one of our most popular activities, with a great atmosphere and a real buzz. With a capacity of 40 it may be advisable to pre-book.

With the funds being reinvested into our community and ideas are welcomed, of how best these funds can support Dirleton.

<u>Community Café - During</u> the winter months October to April 22/23 we have started a Community Café once a month in-between our Lunch Hubs. This is an opportunity to meet informally, offering a range of games and refreshments. With between 8-14 attending.

Other Activities - In the past we have subsidised fitness classes, organised an afternoon tea to celebrate our Late Queen's Jubilee and with others, supported the lighting of the Christmas tree and provided refreshments.

Dirleton gardens are open to the public under Scotland's Gardens Scheme every second year and the next opening will be in 2024. We usually open on both the Saturday and Sunday of the second weekend in June, but the exact dates will be confirmed nearer the time. As well as gardens being opened throughout the village, teas are offered in the Kirk Hall, provided by the RNLI (whose volunteers provide the teas). Gullane and Dirleton History Society



Dirleton Playgroup for 2-5 year olds



Are you looking for quality, affordable childcare in the local area?

Dirleton Playgroup offers a safe, secure and welcoming environment, providing valuable learning opportunities through play for all children from 2-5 years of age. The Playgroup has been running for over 45 years in the local community and supports children and families living in Dirleton and the surrounding areas. Held in the Kirk Hall, the Playgroup is open during school term times on Monday (all day), Tuesday, Thursday and Friday Mornings. Morning sessions (9.15am-12.15pm) currently cost £12, while a Monday longer day session (9.15am-2.15pm) costs £19. Children can attend from age 2-5 years and their names can be added to the waiting list from 18 months.
