The DSP successfully support the school in a variety of ways and work hard with the school to host events/competitions that bring our community together. At this term's coffee morning they worked alongside our P4/5 class and raised **a fabulous £243.** Our P4/5 children also managed to raise **an outstanding £125 for Cancer Research UK** Thank you to all those who contributed in any way to make this another great success.

The next DSP coffee morning will take place on Friday 10th May from 11am.

This will be our final coffee morning hosted by the DSP of this school year and will see our P1/2/3 class working alongside our parents.

The DSP has very successfully worked with the school this year to support the purchase of a variety of resources to support learning and wellbeing. **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) is an area that we are purposefully resourcing as we look to develop our offer in these important areas over the next few years. The school has been striving to provide at least a 1:2 offering of digital devices to our children and this aim will be realised when we roll out this provision in the last term of this school session. Our P4/5/6 & 7 children will have access to an individual digital device and our P1/2/3 children will share 1 between 2. This aim has been supported by our DSP and has helped make this happen. Our developing approach to 'Enterprise Education' is another focus for developing resources and we will be purchasing a suitable 'apple crusher' and other necessary items in preparation of our annual orchard harvest and our other enterprising endeavours.

Other resources that will be purchased in the summer term with the help of the parent council will be related to our priorities of the school year. We will purchase numeracy resources to supplement the very good resources we already have in school. This will support our approach to raising attainment and will be in line with East Lothian's approach to developing numeracy and mathematics. This is an area of our curriculum that we have been developing and the additional resources will be very beneficial and gratefully received from our DSP.

We will continue to add to our literacy resources with funding supported by our DSP, a range of reading books were purchased at the start of the school year and we are now looking to further develop our library to continue promoting an enjoyment of reading across the school.

As we continue to support the Wellbeing, Equality and Inclusion of all we will continue to work with our parents and parent council to consider how we can further develop our approach as a school community.

Without the input of all parents and the members of the DSP the purchase of additional resources for the benefit of your children would not be possible. We are extremely grateful that the opportunity to seek support from parent council fundraising efforts for our additional 'needs and wants' as a school is an option and to the members of the DSP who support the school as it develops.
